Pupil Premium Statement 2016 - 2017 Academic Year

Pupil Premium Funding Received 2016/17 £38,580 27 pupils were eligible for Pupil Premium funding in 2016/17. This represents 17.9% of the school population.

During the school year Pupil Premium Funding was used to:

Provide specific Teaching Assistant learning intervention for identified pupils across the whole school.

Support of a provision map for pupils in Upper Key Stage 2 where gaps in learning were identified and for preparation of external SAT tests in Year 6.

Ensured all pupils had equal opportunities in Music, Sport and extra curriculum activities as well as enrichment activities to the curriculum.

Impact of use of Pupil Premium Funding

The majority of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding in Years 4 to Year 6 made expected progress in Reading and Maths as they moved through the year. Writing is an area for improvement that the school has identified for all pupils as we move into the new school year.

Outcomes for pupil premium pupils compared to all pupils in the school in 2016 - 2017. EYFS

In EYFS 33% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium achieved a Good Level of Development (GLD). This compares to 65% of all pupils in EYFS in the school achieving a GLD in 2017. The national average for pupils achieving a GLD at the end of Year 1 in 2017 is 71%.

Phonics - Year1

There were 2 pupils in Year 1 eligible for pupil premium funding. 100% of pupils eligible for pupil premium funding passed the phonics test this year. 91% of pupils in Year 1 in the school overall passed the phonics test compared to the National Average of 81% in 2017.

End of Key Stage 1 Assessment.

In Year 2 there was 1 pupil eligible for pupil premium funding. This pupil did not achieve the age related outcomes expected in Reading, Writing or Maths this year.

End of Key Stage 2 SAT Tests.

In Year 6 there were 5 pupils eligible for Pupil Premium Funding.

80% of Pupil Premium pupils achieved the level expected of them for their age (ARE) in Reading compared to 59% of pupils eligible for pupil premium nationally in Reading. The overall national average for Reading at the end of Key Stage 2 for all pupils in 2017 is 71%.

60% of Pupil Premium pupils achieved the level expected of them for their age (ARE) in Writing compared to 65% of pupils eligible for pupil premium nationally in Writing. The overall national average for Writing at the end of Key Stage 2 for all pupils in 2017 is 76%.

80% of Pupil Premium Pupils achieved the level expected of them for their age (ARE) in Maths compared to 63% of pupils eligible for pupil premium nationally in Maths. The overall national average for Maths in 2017 is 75%.

100% of Pupil Premium pupils achieved the level expected of them for their age in Spelling and Grammar (SPAG) compared to 67% of all pupils in Year 6. The national average for SPAG for all pupils in 2017 is 77%.
