Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS)

On 19th March 2018 the school was visited by Mr Stephen Green who carried out a SIAMS Inspection of the school.

This inspection seeks to establish how distinctive and effective the school is as a church school (and is additional to the Ofsted Inspection carried out on all schools).

A link to the full report can now be found on our website but we wanted to highlight some of the Inspector's comments:

A church leader described the 'privilege of working with the children' due to their impeccable behaviour and positive attitudes.

Pupils have a good record of putting their faith into practice in support of others and have supported a number of local and national charities in recent years.

There is a strong relationship with the local church and the school values the regular input of the new incumbent both in CW and as vice-chair of the governing body and the school's only foundation governor at the time of the inspection.

Relationships within the school are extremely positive and adults provide excellent role models for the children in their care. Parents greatly value the school's family atmosphere and appreciate the approachability of the senior and teaching staff.

There is a very active parent support group which raises funds to enhance educational provision.

Relationships within the school are very strong, reflecting the school's Christian values and commitment, and are valued by parents. The school's Christian values inform and drive pupils' moral, social and cultural development. Pupils respect each other and other members of the school community and can explain that this links to their learning and the school's Christian values.

.....in the worship seen during the inspection, the children were attentive and interested.

They articulate and actively promote a vision based on their own and the school's

Parents spoke enthusiastically about the school's programme for worship, and of the impact which the school's Christian values, as developed in CW, have upon their children.

Parents are frequently invited to join CW, especially in the church, and many do so.

The current values are displayed widely around the school and are very familiar to pupils.
