Dear Parents

We hope you all had an enjoyable half term break. Now that the weather has turned noticeably colder, please can you ensure that children come to school in a warm, waterproof coat and school shoes and that a pair of wellies are kept permanently at school.

New Members of Staff

We are pleased to announce that we have recently appointed 2 relief Midday Supervisors -Mrs Emily Buckingham and Mrs Amanda Read who are both parents at school, to work with our children. In addition, Mrs Donna Medcalf will be working in our Early Birds Club with Mrs Large.

Early Birds Club

This club continues to be popular with our parents and the new system of charging (50p per child, per day) appears to be working well. Just a reminder that there is a limit of 20 places per day which must be booked in advance. However booked places must be paid for and you will be still be expected to pay for your place, even if your child does not attend for whatever reason, and there will be no refunds. If you know in advance that your child will not be attending, we would appreciate it if you could let us know as a matter of courtesy, so that the place can be made available to someone else if required. We do hope that along with the other options in the morning - Cygnets, supervised drop off in Stanningfield Road and Community Centre park and walk, that parents find a method which suits them. Classroom doors open at 8.50am—please do not leave your child/ren unsupervised on the playground before this time. Payments remain flexible, however if you wish to pay weekly monthly or termly by cheque (payable to Suffolk County Council) we would appreciate this.

Safe Parking and Drop Off

The yellow zigzag lines were remarked and extended in the half term break and we hope this makes it clearer and safer for our pedestrians. We understand however that some parents have been parking in the bus lane. Please could this be kept clear at all times to facilitate supervised drop offs. Please also note that the school car park is out of bounds for pedestrians.

KS1 trip to the Discovery Centre and the Cathedral

On 20th October we took the children from Year 1 and Year 2 to the Cathedral for a Saint Edmunds day. We have been learning about Saint Edmund as part of our local History curriculum on 'significant historical events people and places in their own locality'.
