This is going to be a very exciting day in Great Whelnetham. Additionally in school, we will be having our second **Enrichment Day**. Like the first Enrichment Day this will be a whole school event, children working in mixed groups, moving around a carousel of activities. This Enrichment day is themed around Kagera. The Diocese of St Edmundsbury has a partnership link with the Kagera Diocese, which is situated in the top north western corner of Tanzania in Africa. Despite much poverty, the church is growing in Kagera and many social, medical and educational programmes are run locally by its clergy and Mother's Union. Hence the donations raised on Friday will go directly to the many good causes in Kagera.
