
Dear Parents and Robins Class,

## **English**

Year 1: **Fiction Writing** – using one of our favourite books 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea! The grammar focus is to understand how to identify and write questions. You will use a story map to help you rewrite the story.



Year 2: **Writing a recount** – You will write a diary entry of the moment Lila met the pirates! The key feature is to make sure you write your entry in a chronological order. Challenge yourself by using subordinating conjunctions 'because' and 'when'

## Maths

Year 1: Comparing numbers within 100

Year 2: Fractions – identify  $\frac{1}{3}$   $\frac{1}{3}$  of a shape. We have covered this in class...can you remember how we cut out some shapes to help us?
