We are delighted to welcome to Great Whelnetham Primary, our new reception children and their families. The children are all settling in beautifully and are getting to know each other and the school environment. We are very proud of them.

Please also join us in welcoming Paige and Freddy to Robins class, Jeremiah in Owls class and Scarlett and Molly in Swans class. Finally, we also welcome Miss Rodda who joins us as a one-to-one Teaching Assistant in Swans class.

New Website

We are very excited to share with you that we have a new website, which we hope will provide you with easy access to key information, dates and announcements. You will also be able to find lots of important information about the school, including what your children will be learning. We are very excited about this and feel that it reflects the wonderful work that is continuing within school. Our school Facebook page continues to provide daily updates from each class and celebrates the children's learning experience across the school.

Universal Infant Free School Meals

The children in Reception, Yr. I and Yr.2 will receive a free school meal under the government's universal free school meal scheme. Free school meals (FSM) are different to UIFSM (above) and are available to children of families who are in receipt of certain government credits and allowances. The school would also receive additional funding to help support your child in other ways such as academic and financial support. If you need any assistance with this then please do contact the school.



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Medication

Could I ask all parents to ensure that they have brought in all inhalers and epi pens for those children who have been prescribed them; please make sure that these are clearly named and are in date. Thank you.

Snacks and Water Bottles

Please can you make sure that your child has a **named** water bottle in school. They will need to bring it in every **Monday** and take it home on a Friday to be washed. Children in Y3,4,5 & 6 are encouraged to bring in a healthy snack to have at break time, children in Reception, Year I and 2 are provided with a free school snack of fresh fruit and vegetables.

Uniform and PE Kit

Please make sure that your child has their PE kit in school with all items clearly named. Their PE kit will remain in school until half term (excluding Swans). They will also need a pair of **named** trainers to be kept in school

Nut Allergy Reminder

Please can we remind you all that because we have a number of children who are severely allergic to nuts all packed lunches need to be nut free. You will need to check the ingredients in snack biscuits and bars etc. Thank you in advance for supporting the school over this.

Music Tuition

It is very exciting that this term, children in Swans class will be learning how to play the flute! We will be having a specialist music teacher who will be coming into school every Friday, starting next week. We are certain that the children will really enjoy this experience and look forward to attending one of their concerts some time very soon!

<u>PTFA</u>

PTFA are our parent committee who meet every half term or so to plan and organise events for the children and their families to enjoy. These events raise money for the school which is invaluable as it provides the school the ability to purchase equipment or arrange events that may not otherwise be possible.
