Swans class hold their own Ancient Greek Olympics!

Swans (Year 5/6) started their new topic by preparing and holding an Ancient Greek Olympics! They learnt about the origins of the Games, the events that were competed for and how the athletes prayed to the god Zeus for a good performance. The children took part in a foot race where they had to

wear a helmet and hold a shield, a standing long jump holding weights to help them jump further, the javelin and a chariot race where a driver had to hold hands with a team of 3 'horses'! They had great fun and only one child was vaporised by Zeus for running outside of the track limits! The winners of each event received a laurel wreath, and the winning team overall was Delphi, whose shield showed a design of the Greek letter Epsilon.

Fitzwillilam Museum, Cambridge Visit

On Weds 15th January, Swans class went for an exciting trip to the world-renowned Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge to complement their Ancient Greeks topic. They enjoyed a workshop with one of the museum's experts on Greek history, learnt a

huge amount about their life and beliefs, and saw a range of genuine objects and statues, some of which were nearly 3,000 years old! The children had a great time and can now put their knowledge to good use as they create their own gods and myths in English lessons!



Aurora Orchestra – 23 March 2020

On Monday 23 March 2020 the Aurora Orchestra are coming to play at The Apex in Bury St Edmunds. In the afternoon of the concert our Year 4,5 and 6 pupils are going to The Apex to take part in one of the orchestra's immersed workshops.

They will attend a rehearsal of one of Aurora's unique memorised performances, when the musicians perform without sheet music, stands or chairs (it is extremely rare for an orchestra to do this and something that Aurora has done to great acclaim at recent BBC Proms concerts in the Albert Hall). Our children will have the rare chance to go right inside the orchestra - up close to the musicians and instruments – allowing them to discover great symphonic works in a powerful way (on this occasion, Beethoven's Pastoral Symphony). It promises to be a great experience.




VIII phoned the school to confirm his visit on Weds 1st April. We look forward to welcoming his Royal Highness (and have told the children to be on their best behaviour!)




