
evacuee's suitcase, complete with its contents. A great way to do some hands on learning whilst celebrating this important anniversary. I bet it really brought to life

As always, we want you to access your learning how and when fits in best with your family. Remember you can look back at the suggestions we have sent you since this term began. Little and

often seems to work well, so don't forget to enjoy your breaks and not to worry or get anxious about your work.

The main resources we have suggested for online learning are <u>The Oak National Academy</u> and <u>BBC</u> bitesize Daily lessons.

English

The Oak National Academy Year 4 will be looking at a new unit on <u>Persuasive Writing</u> this week. It will look at the key features of the genre and will end in you writing your own <u>persuasive rap</u>, inspired by one written and performed by other Year 4 children.

Oak Academy has a video tutorial, practice questions and then online questions for you to complete at the end. They cover both reading and writing skills and build from one another, explaining really clearly what skills you are developing. Your Spellings are included and this week the words have the suffix 'ation' added to verbs to form nouns'.

BBC Bitesize starts by looking at **Recounts** and has a video clip to watch and some questions for you to practise.

Oak Academy continues to look at Measures but this week focuses on time and money.

BBC Bitesize is working on <u>Multipying and dividing problem solving</u> and finishes the week with challenge questions of what you've previously learnt.

Oak Academy continues lessons on <u>Spain</u>, looking at the language (how to say the date in Spanish) and the history focus of <u>The Spanish Armada</u>. The Science lesson continues looking at aspects of learning about light and focuses on <u>How we See Light.</u>

BBC Bitesize looks at historic monuments, in particular **Stonehenge**.

Remember you can also choose some of your own research based learning doing the <u>'Pirates' or 'Food' projects</u> we sent home at the start of the term.
