Year 5/6 Trip to the Ipswich Museum

On Tuesday 26th March, Years 5 and 6 enjoyed a trip to Ipswich Museum and took part in their Ancient Egyptians workshop. After being helped to understand how to handle precious objects, we were allowed to carefully pass around some genuine artifacts, some of which were 3000 years old. We spent time in the 'tomb' room, where there was an actual mummy in the sarcophagus! We also made clay figures (which can be buried as offerings with our fish!) and designed our own animal God. It was great fun and we learnt lots to help us with our topic.
