He likes stories, but rarely wants to read himself for enjoyment. This is despite many fiction and nonfiction books being available at home. He struggles with staying still long enough to get into a book.</p> <p>My child struggles with reading so hence not motivated although the new factual books are helping.</p>				
Do you feel you are able to support your child confidently with their reading at home? Is there more we can offer you to help with this?	<p>Yes, I am able to help at home with her reading. She sometimes needs me to encourage her to read her school book if it's not something she likes but the majority she does. The home reading initiative has really helped as she desperately wants to win so she reads every day. She is now able to read really well and tackle most difficult words with ease. She loves to read a bedtime story to her brothers too. Because of the initiative at school, she wants to buy her own reading books to read at home, it has given her the extra push she needed and I am very pleased with her ability and the school's efforts.</p> <p>Both my husband and myself are able to support our son with his reading at home. The bookmark scheme (school initiative) helps because he wants to achieve the next bookmark stage. We read every week day and suggest that he reads a the weekend. He shows enthusiasm at first, but becomes bored easily and does not want to find our what happens next in the book.</p> <p>My son loves reading and we encourage it.</p> <p>Yes I am able to support my child.</p> <p>Yes we do.</p>				

We try to get in a reading habit but other activities seem to be a higher priority. We will be trying to get a better structure to encourage regular reading.

Yes we do. We are fortunate in that our daughter enjoys reading and is a fluid reader. I do feel you could encourage some more home reading competitions. The bookmark challenge requires regular feedback and communication as we are unsure of our child's progress.

Yes, more support for Dad's. We would appreciate taking this from the teacher.

Additional comments:

When asked about his reading at school he says that he reads with a teacher once every two weeks. Could this be done more regularly. His reading seems okay despite not enjoying books, but I am concerned that he is unable to find any books that he likes to read himself. He does mention a fact from a non-fiction book at school so I take this to mean he is doing some self-directed reading at school and enjoying it enough to bring it up at home.

My son is very behind in his reading, we have noticed that there has been new books for his reading level, which has really helped him.

Could the school collaborate with the Bury St Edmund's library. This facility is not used enough and I feel the children may benefit from an activity where they are encouraged to visit here with parents.

Enjoyment continues to grow as he is becoming a more confident, independent reader. Super progress made loves the signed bookmarks rewards. Now reads his own books as a choice! Yes!
