We are very excited that on 4th December Key Stage Two pupils will be having a special show from the Cambridge Science Centre entitled "Destination Space!"

Here is a description of the show:

Ever wondered what it's like to be an astronaut? How do you get into space, and what's it like to live and work there? Learn how the physics of Isaac Newton's laws got us into space and ride on a hover board. Experience some of the dangers of going into space with our vacuum chamber and our blowtorch - and find out how we used science to overcome these challenges.

Swans class will also be having a "Destination Space" workshop afterwards to learn more about their Space Science topic.

School Improvement

We have been working hard on priorities from the last Ofsted Inspection and wanted to take this opportunity to share some really great feedback. We had a visit from Karen Harman the Deputy Diocesan Director of Education in the first half of term who described the school as "Calm bright and cared for. I really enjoyed looking round .The feel and atmosphere of the school have been significantly changed and you have achieved a lot in just six weeks".

We then had a visit from advisor John Atkinson who praised pupil behaviour highly commenting that "The children are a hugely positive group of people—full of optimism, ambition and desire".

Finally our Chair of Governors Caroline Robinson and Chair of Learning and Achievement Committee Paul Kirkwood undertook some pupil perception questionnaires and were really pleased to hear that the children are so highly engaged with their learning, topics and lessons.

The whole school community will continue to work hard and build upon the great progress made in the Autumn Term.
