I am writing to update you on what was an incredibly busy last half term. It was remarkable what everyone crammed in to just four and half weeks and I am incredibly proud of all our children and staff.

Swans successfully completed their KS2 SATs exams and will continue this half term with their transition activities in readiness for high school. The end of year play rehearsals are now in full swing too.

Robins have equally worked successfully throughout the whole of May to complete their KS1 SATs assessments and Larks have been extremely well prepared for the Year 1 Phonics screening check taking place next week.

We continue to raise funds towards replacing our outdoor play equipment.
